

City Avenue Special Services District

City Ave District is one of five business associations officially recognized by Lower Merion Township. In addition to receiving both local and state grant funding, City Ave District has been empowered through an act of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to levy an assessment tax on all commercial properties in within the confines of the improvement district. These funds are used for:

- small business counseling and support
- public space improvements
- transportation and pedestrian infrastructure

Lower Merion Township/Montgomery County

Local Colleges and Universities

Many of our local colleges and Universities offer small business development programs.

- Villanova University offers an Innovation Fund, which offers new businesses, products, and organizations. It offers six different application windows over the course of the year.
- St. Joseph's University offers a unique entrepreneurship training program for veterans. Since 2015, the program has supported over 200 veterans in starting their own business.
- Temple University's Small Business Development Center offers tailored workshops, mentorship programs, and training courses for small business.
